

1960-1969

In December 1960, the Chapter sponsored a successful fundraiser, the Ebony Fashion Show. The proceeds allowed the Chapter to purchase a baby grand piano for the Women's Civic Improvement Club Center, and make substantial contributions to the Sacramento Society for the Blind, the Mental Health Association, and the Southern Christian Leadership Conference. The Chapter became paid life members of the Urban League and the NAACP.

As a mixed chapter, Delta Theta began its quest to bring more undergraduates into its membership. At the Chapter's 1968 Fall Tea, "New Faces in the Community", educators within the community were introduced. The program highlighted new Black businesses through displays.
