## *Sacramento Alumnae Chapter* **Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.**

### **1990-1999**

The Chapter continues its public service and fundraising activities expanded in the 80s. While our own Soror June Long was serving as Regional Director, she had a vision. From that vision, Delta Youth State was born as part of Delta Days at the Capitol with our very own Soror Gloria Robertson serving as the first Youth State Coordinator. This workshop is a living civics lesson that allows students to discuss state budget issues (during a crisis period), establish priorities, and develop draft bills in response to community issues while role playing as legislators.

The Delta Youth State program officially became a part of the National Delta Social Action Program in 1991. Delta Days and Delta Youth State at the Capitol still continues today. Piloted by the Spring 1996 Line, the Chapter hosted a full day speed-mentoring event for teenage girls, which developed into the Delta Teens program and soon after was designated as the African Sistahs United (A.S.U.) program. That program later evolved into what was known as the Dr. Betty Shabazz Senior Academy Program
